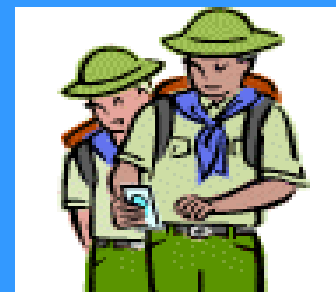

The following items should be left in your car until it is time to set up camp.

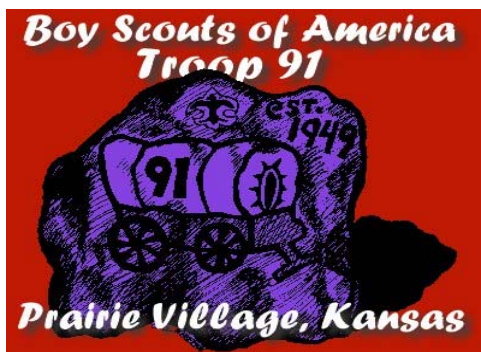
Change of Clothes	Personal Camping Gear
